1	ŚRODEK	
	1 1 Maja St	

The alluring nook with some deckchairs and tables between the Polish Theatre and railroad is only the prelude. The main part is situated in the old cellars under the theatre. The club itself is a taproom, café and bistro – all in one. Apart from a wide choice of craft beers, there's wine straight from the barrel, Czech kofola and Italian coffee. You may play board games here, buy some souvenirs from Bielsko-Biala, or even attend a meeting with a brewer, or a bking event.

2	AQUARIUM	
	11 3 Maja St	

It's a lively and busy place! On the first floor of the Bielska BWA Art Gallery you may sit down on one of many wooden chairs, at rooftop-high windows, and enjoy a cup of specialty coffee, a piece of homemade cake or a glass of craft beer – all that while admiring the exhibition on one of café's tables. The schedule here is really busy – meetings with interesting people, workshops, concerts, film showings. Almost every day!

3	myBB	
	5a Krasniskiego St	

Integration Centre for Foreigners in Bielsko-Biala not only provides counseling services and offers free Polish language classes, but also organizes a wide variety of cultural events. You can meet new people here, play board games or go on a city sightseeing walk while practising a foreign language. Check their current schedule on their facebook page.

4	redakcjaBB	
	5a Krasniskiego St	

It's much more than just the editorial office of *redakcjaBB* – a free magazine created entirely by young residents of Bielsko-Biala. Creative workshops and meetings with interesting people take place here as well. And not only that – in this great spot in the very centre of the city you can hang out, talk to locals, have some tea and surf the Net – just like that. Come around on weekdays between 11:00 AM and 6:00 PM

5	BIELSKA BWA ART GALLERY	
	11 3 Maja St	

Ready for some culture? Feel free to visit a gallery that's friendly not only to connoisseurs. BWA fosters interesting modern art: painting, graphics, photography, installations and performance. Local artists don't pass unnoticed as well, and the institution often carries out projects in the public space. You may want to check whether there's a concert or any other event happening apart from the exhibition in BWA. Curiosity: before World War II there used to be an impressive synagogue here – read the memorial in the back of the gallery!

13	ASSAM TEAHOUSE	
	9 Cieszyńska St	

First comes the smell: a bit like incense, tea, and oriental bazaar. Inside you're greeted by a scene straight from *The One Thousand and One Nights*. In order to immerse yourself deeper in this special atmosphere, you can order tea, shisha or snacks typical for the Middle East, am make yourself comfortable on the embroidered cushions. In the wintertime, on the other hand, go downstairs, sink into the armchair and look at crackling fire in the fireplace.

14	GRAWITACJA	
	3 Wzgórze St	

An establishment with a golden bike and with books and chairs piling up the ceiling, yet it stands firmly on the ground unchanging though, in the same place, in spite of growing competition. For years it has been known as a welcoming place for cultural and artistic initiatives. Grawitacja attracts new generations that appreciate its unpretentious atmosphere. Every Monday Travellers' Meetings take place here, gathering people curious about the world.

15	JARMUŻNO	
	57b 11 Listopada St	

In spite of the fact that Jarmuzno is situated outside of the city centre, it's worth a walk up 11 Listopada Street – in the past days the city's main artery. Right there, in a cosy house with a little garden, you'll taste healthy, nutritious, meat-free dishes. And what about a reward for a long walk? You'll be offered friendly service and your dishes will be made from carefully chosen, fresh, and often locally sourced ingredients. You may follow the changes on the menu on their facebook page.

16	MASALA	
	5 Przybyły St	

A tiny bistro that specializes in original vegan cuisine, often with oriental touch. The menu changes daily, but one thing stays the same: the food will be fancy, colourful, healthy and delicious. And for the dessert – magnificent gluten-free cakes. You can take a peek inside the kitchen (and even the pans) through the counter; usually occupied by regular customers, who engage in conversation with the cooks. Caution! It's open only on weekdays.

17	MONO	
	13 Barlickiego St	

An absolutely unique patisserie and bistro. In the stylish interior you can have freshly baked bread for breakfast, while beautifully served lunch will satisfy even most sophisticated tastes. Among different sweet treats, precious mono-portion desserts – modern sweet works of art – define the place. It may take up to three days to create these French desserts. In Mono you'll also find traditional Japanese tea – matcha. World-class level at surprisingly good prices.

18	B&B PHOTO GALLERY	
	12 1 Maja St	

A must-see for all photography lovers. Entering the three rooms in the Włókniarzy Community Centre is like entering a different world. Or rather different worlds because the exhibitions here change frequently. This photo gallery, founded by renowned photographers Andrzej and Inez Baturo, has operated continuously since 1992, and thanks to keeping high artistic level has been widely acclaimed all over the country. Every other year, thanks to FotoArtFestival, world-class photos are presented in various places in Bielsko-Biala. Check it out!

19	MUSEUM OF FIAT 126P	
	44 Karpacza St	

The only official museum of the Polish Fiat 126p, aka *maluch* (toddler), run by Antoni Przychodźcin, the co-founder of Polish Association of Antique Cars. The collection consists of 35 cars (many of which are one of a kind), but only the renovated, registered, insured and ready to go are on display now. Make sure to call the museum in advance if you want to come.

20	POLISH THEATRE	
	1 1 Maja St	

An architectural jewel designed by a Viennese architect Emil von Förster, and one of the reasons why Bielsko-Biala is sometimes called *Little Vienna*. Take a close look at the statue of Apollo and Muses on the façade. And if you attend a performance, notice the fabulous curtain (which hung already there at the first performance!) with the Dance of the Nymphs. In the cellar there's a tap bar, café and bistro Środek.

21	WIRTUOZERIA	
	39 Pocztowa St	

If you look for a unique place – this is one of them! After a walk in the nearby Cygański Las or Błonia, or after an exciting enduro ride, you can enjoy a meal or a locally brewed beer. The interior design is a mixture of steampunk pieces and moving mockups of an old brewery. If you peek through the window, you may see the fermentation tanks. Why don't you come and see for yourself?

22	CREMINO	
	10 1 Maja St	

Exquisite cakes and pies, excellent coffee and the shop's story – all that is worth discovering. Here you can eat something delicious and find inspiration to follow your passion – because the Cremino's owner started out as a sole proprietor, offering celebration cakes for different occasions. If you drop by, you may come across actors from the nearby Polish Theatre, who often hang out here.

23	KLUB MIASTO	
	2 Mickiewicza Sq	

Here you can have both a meal and a drink; listen to music and dance. You can take part in a meeting about cryptocurrency, and buy some vinyls on a swap meet. There are concerts and stand-ups. It's also a perfect place for karaoke fans and for other hobbyists. If you haven't made your plans for tonight yet, check Klub Miasto's programme.

24	WeCoffee	
	27 11 Listopada St	

Don't be fooled by the modest size of this coffee shop. Behind the small interior (that delights even the most sophisticated taste) there's a big, local, family-owned coffee roaster. Apart from coffee and sweet snacks you can get here multiple accessories, mugs and 1 Love BB souvenirs. You may meet WeCoffee outdoors as well – for example at an Amputee Football game played by our local Kuloodporni team from Bielsko-Biala.

25	KAWIARNIA KOZAK	
	25 Słowackiego St	

Small, stylish, minimalist – and the coffee served here is truly rich in flavour. Whether you're on your way to a concert in Bielsko Cultural Centre, or to the nearby Słowackiego Park for a walk – it's worth coming in here. Where's the entrance? Look for the neon sign.

26	IRE'N'KA	
	27 Rynek	

Another micro café that's worth visiting. Thanks to the most unusual coffee machine that you'll probably see for the first time in your life (it's the only one in Poland), every single cup of coffee has a unique taste. Plus, coffee beans straight from the owner's own roaster. And what about the neighbourhood? Dog's Bollocks and Szpilka – two well-known restaurants that have already earned their names among the inhabitants of Bielsko-Biala. On the menu you'll find the whole gamut of snacks and drinks – from burgers to fancy cocktails.

27	RUDE BOY	
	20 1 Maja St	

An unmissable spot on the underground city map. A place that attracts independent artists and niche projects, that tone in with rough, post-industrial interiors. Fans of heavy music will like the atmosphere of Thursday *Czad Party* events. An annual event *Nationalism? No, thanks!* that has been organised here for years, gathers a regular, dedicated audience.

28	TOFU BISTRO	
	17 Barlickiego St	

An inconspicuous bistro situated in the cellar, run since 2014 by an enthusiastic, passionate owner. On the menu you'll find vegan burgers and tortillas, gluten-free dishes, soups, salads, and a different plat du jour at a reasonable price every day. Healthy and straight from the heart.



29	CHMIELOWE PODCIEŃIA	
	3 Podcienie St	

One of the longest-operating restaurants in Bielsko-Biala that offers craft beers. It's located in the antique market, and the interior brings to mind a Czech inn. Visitors are greeted by a long bar and an impressive gallery of craft beer bottles. It's a professional taproom, and snacks are served here as well – i.a. from local manufacturers. A perfect place for those who look for gastro-beer satisfaction.

30	FARMA CAFE	
	7 Smolk Sq	

In the cozy, homelike atmosphere (in the wintertime, by the fireplace), you can have some high-quality tea, coffee or hot chocolate here. There are some snacks and delicious desserts as well. A tip for those always starving – ask for a "Farewell with Hunger", in spite of the fact that you won't find it listed on the menu.

31	BANIALUKA PUPPET THEATRE	
	20 Mickiewicza St	

One of the most famous and oldest puppet theatres in the world, founded in 1947. During the biennial International Festival of Puppetry Art you can watch the best performances from all over the world. In the programme you'll find theatre plays not only for children, but also for the mature audience – both types are worth seeing. Remember to take your younger siblings to a show!

32	PROPER	
	10 Przekop St	

Not so long ago it used to be just a tiny coffee bar in the city centre; today it's a spacious establishment nestled in a revitalized industrial area next to an old textile mill. That's why the place has an industrial touch and it's a bit offbeat, stylish, and comfortable at the same time. Not to mention the coffee which is freshly roasted in the room behind the counter – take a look! How to spend a lazy day? Drop by!

33	CELNA 10	
	10 Celna St	

The interior of an old town house, that evokes memories of past times, has been meticulously adapted to its new role – as a meeting place and a perfect venue for late-night talks. A number of chairs and tables of different styles fill the chain of rooms, while in the courtyard deckchairs are at guests' disposal. Apart from craft beers and snacks, you may enjoy live music here as well.

34	PIWNICA ZAMKOWA	
	16 Wzgórze St	

It's called the only cellar in Poland that you enter via staircase that goes up. It owes its unique atmosphere to its excellent location in the antique underground halls of the Sulkowski Castle. In the summer, you can watch the nearby Chrobrego Square from the patio, and take part in various concerts, meetings and exhibitions all year long. That's what you call a princely setting!

35	PIEROŻEK	
	24 Rynek	

An iconic cafeteria with a 40-year-old tradition and intrinsic atmosphere. Everyone comes to eat at Pierozek – from students from the nearby schools to the Lord Mayor himself. The specialty of the house are steamed yeast dumplings served with fruit, chocolate or sugar. Just like in every respected cafeteria, you may order half a serving. Quick, traditional and in the very Market Place!

36	DELICJE	
	1 3 Maja St	

Artisan ice-cream parlours spring up like mushrooms, yet the taste of tradition is irreplaceable. That's why we invite you to an ice-cream parlour that has been in Bielsko-Biala for 40 years! It offers not only ice-cream, but also jelly with whipped cream, various puddings and cream rolls... Grab one and feel the old-school spirit! The ladies behind the counter invariably take care of the right flavour (and the atmosphere).

37	MAGIC VR	
	26-28 Legionów St	

Welcome to the world of Virtual Reality! At the first glance it's just an inconspicuous room, white walls, a lone computer and a screen. Only a moment separates you from an adventure – just put on the special glasses and there you are standing on the deck of a sunken ship, and a whale is swimming right next to you. There are around 40 games available at present, but the offer changes dynamically, so that you don't miss out on the latest hits. Up to 9 players may play simultaneously.

	STATUES OF CARTOON CHARACTERS

Every day, in the streets of Bielsko-Biala, you have a chance to meet real movie stars. We mean of course the characters from cartoons created by Studio Filmów Rysunkowych, one of the oldest Polish film studios. It was here where children's favourite cartoons, like *Bolek and Lolek* or *Reksio*, came to life, with each frame carefully drawn. It took months and dozens of artists to produce an episode of a few minutes. While following the path of cartoon characters, don't forget to check what Bolek is pointing at with his forefinger.

You may browse an excellent guide *Murals Bielsko-Biala* available on webpage galeriabielska.pl/en – find it and hit the road in search for those paintings of enormous sizes that depict i.a. folk and industrial motives, abstract compositions and symbolic pictures.

44	MUSEUM OF LITERATURE	
	1 Pankiewicza St	

Most probably the only place of this kind in the world. When you enter it, you enter a totally different world. Nowhere else will you see novels by a famous Polish author: a Nobel Prize laureate, Władysław Reymont, hand-rewritten and hand-illustrated by the host of the museum, Tadeusz Modrzejewski. You should definitely ask him – also known as the last Polish scribe – to tell you the story. So, how about time-travel?

45	METRUM	
	22 Paryżantów St	

A place for connoisseurs of sophisticated live music. The air here, however, isn't created only by music, but also by the stylish, spacious interiors that refer to traditional jazz clubs, with a touch of post-industrial vibes – that's because it's situated in an old carding factory. Moreover, there's a well-stocked bar with a vast choice that satisfies all tastes. In the club, there are also music parties with DJs, regular meetings for entrepreneurs, and other events – don't forget to check the programme!

46	BROWAR MIJSKI	
	2 Piwowska St	

A brewery not only by name – a copper kettle used for boiling malt that's situated at the entrance to the old town house isn't just a decoration. Here you may not only taste the only Bielsko-Biala beer straight from the tank, but also watch the whole brewing process. The location wasn't chosen at random – there was a brewery in the next town house in the mid-19th century. The restaurant is notable for local Silesian dishes. The quality and the size of the servings fully justify the not-so-low prices.

LOOKING FOR ACCOMMODATION?

If couchsurfing or Airbnb isn't your cup of tea, and staying in a mountain lodge seems to be out of reach, check local hostels – e.g. Szkolne Schronisko Modrzejewo (Youth Hostel), Hello Hostel, Dot Hostel, Noclegi pod Zamkiem, Dom Turysty PTTK, Industrial Hostel, HOSTEL4YOU.

TRAMPOLINE PARKS

JUMPOWNIA 71 Partyzantów St
Jump with a basketball, dive into the pool filled with sponge pieces, try your luck on an obstacle course for ninjas and track your time to compare your score with your friends. On the floors in Jumphownia all jumpers, young and older, will find something to their liking.

GOJump 26-28 Legionów St
Try to move with grace on a gymnastics mat, jump on a giant pillow and play dodgeball on a special arena. At GOJump you may also try special supert trampolines for professionals and win awesome prizes.

LUISE VALLEY & WAPIENICA DAM

One of the most magical places in Bielsko-Biala which is partly a meadow where you can come across trees of natural monument category, and spot protected species of plants and animals. The Wapienica Dam – which was made available to public some time ago – cuts the valley in halves, thus creating a picturesque lake surrounded by mountains. The best spot to admire them is on the patio of Krzyża Chata (Crooked Hut). And if you plan to get to Wapienica by bike, you need to stop by Bar Strudzonych Rowerzystów (Tired Bikers' Bar) in Łowiecka Street.

SWIMMING POOLS

PANORAMA 5 Konopnickiej St
A swimming pool with a history – when it was built in 1936, it was one of the most technologically advanced pools in Europe. Today it's an open-air swimming pool, operating in the summer. There's a pool of the Olympic size (50 m), and the bravest swimmers may jump to water from the towers of 3 m and 5 m.

START 36 Startowa St
A modern complex of open-air swimming pools, and apart from that – all you need to spend your time actively: beach volleyball, streetball and tennis courts, and a climbing wall. Open in the summer. When the weather is good, you may expect a number of other keen swimmers.

TROCLIK 14 gen. Sosnkowskiego St
A modern indoor swimming pool with two pools fitted with lighting (for sports and for recreation), a slide, hydro-air massage tubs, and a heat-storage sauna.

AQUA 26 Langiewicza St
A swimming pool on the outskirts of the city, where you can go for a swim even late at night (open till midnight). You'll find a sport pool and a recreational pool with hydromassage here. The ticket price includes a visit to a heat-storage sauna.

SPORT AIRFIELD

along Lotnicza and Zwardońska St
A place for easy walks, with a bike path, a rollerblading track and benches along the path. A great view on the mountains and the city, with planes and gliders that take off and land right there. This place has a remarkable history – the gliders that have been produced in Bielsko-Biala for years are well-known and recognized by pilots all over the world. Moreover, Sebastian Kawa, a competitor of the Bielsko-Biala Aeroclub and a physician by profession, is a multiple-time World Champion in competitive gliding.

STRACONKA BOULEVARDS

along Górská St
This place has recently regained its glory thanks to a huge investment carried out by the Municipal Office. While some residents miss the previous "wilderness" and sunbathing on the banks of the Straconka stream, many have found the boulevards a perfect spot for weekend strolls and children's games – there are playgrounds and other attractions for children. There's also a football pitch, a volleyball court, and a skatepark, popular among teenagers and grown-ups.

ZYGZAK

26-28 Legionów St
Multilevel indoor karting track, the longest in Poland! Just perfect for those who love adrenaline and high speed. Beginners may give it a try in a two-seater go-kart. The more the merrier. The track is situated in Nowe Miasto (New Town) – a revitalized post-industrial venue where you may find a lot of other attractions, i.e. a restaurant, a fitness club or a trampoline park GOJump.

AMPHITHEATRE IN LIPNIK

access from Polna St
At the beginning of the 20th century the forests in Lipnik were a popular strolling area. In the 1930s, with the help of the locals, an amphitheatre was built. Stone benches were placed on a natural slope, around a big glade. Perhaps in the nearby future local authorities will restore it to its former glory – there are plans to revitalize this place. So far, however, the neglected amphitheatre brings to mind ancient remains. It's definitely a spot for someone who looks for quaint places.

ICE RINK

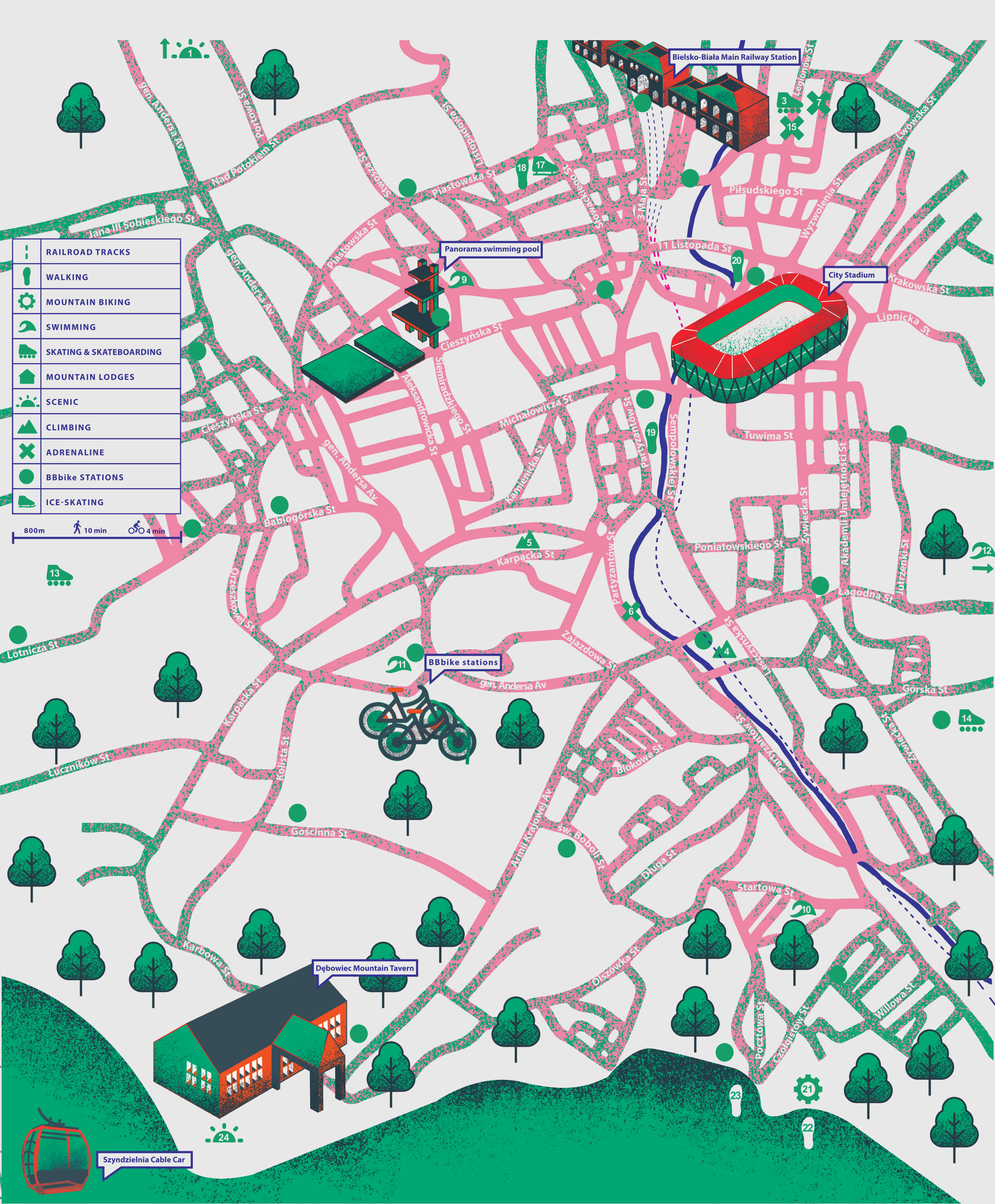
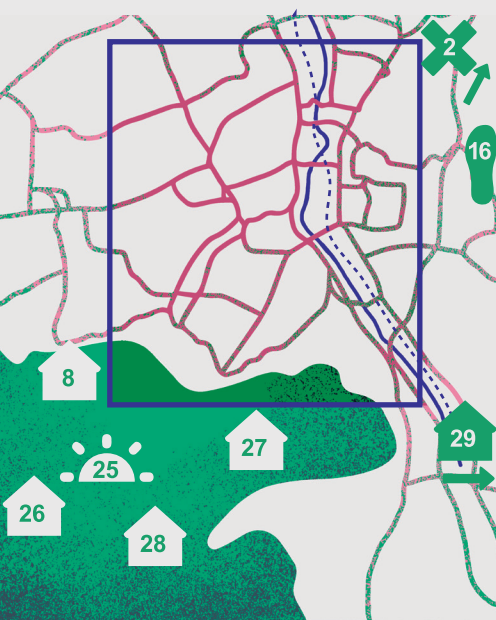
27b Słowackiego St
That's not the atmosphere of the old-school ice rink from Żywiecka Street with garland bulbs and dangerously uneven surface. Here, on the contrary, you'll enjoy a smooth ride, surrounded by many other skaters. For those of you who don't have skates – you can rent them on site. And outside of the skating season you can come and play basketball here under the roof, or have a workout on the sports ground outside.

CITY PARKS

PARK SŁOWACKIEGO
This park has recently undergone a revitalisation and now attracts visitors with a new fountain and a playground. It's situated next to Bielsko Cultural Centre and an all-year sports ground onlik. From here you'll see the impressive edifice that houses the 1st Nicolaus Copernicus High School that's over 100 years old.

PARK WŁÓKNIARZY
It's situated along the Biała River that used to separate two towns, Bielsko and Biala, and in the earlier times marked the borders of the Kingdom of Poland. In the park, apart from refreshing coolness of old trees' shadows, you'll find a statue of Adam Mickiewicz, a national poet. On the other side of the river there's a factory founded in 1945 – Białmar – known in the whole country for Palma margarine.

PARK ZA RATUSZEM
A piece of green space in the very centre of the town, again – on the river bank. You'll come across some puzzling statues here, and among these – a cartoon character Pampalini and... a fire salamander. A special treat for treasure hunters.



ENDURO TRAILS

Info point: Błonia
This network of mountain biking trails is one of the highlights of Bielsko-Biala that we are particularly proud of. It started as a citizens' project in the Participatory Budgeting. Today it's a well-established initiative attracting numbers of mountain bikers – from families with children to professional riders. Everyone can find a trail at a difficulty level suited to their skills. The trail network and infrastructure keep expanding, encompassing more and more mountains, so you can come across bike riders almost everywhere. Join them!

BŁONIA

Pocztowa St
A green spot on the city map, full of attractions. There's a pump track and a training ground for free biking enthusiasts. You can also ask professional instructors for some advice, rent equipment and learn more about Enduro Trails. Apart from that – a skate park, a football pitch and a basketball court, playgrounds and pure joy of spending time outdoors. If you get thirsty and hungry – a few open-air bars, including Rowerownia and Bike Bar, where you can relax on deckchairs after physical activity.

CYGAŃSKI LAS

A taste of a real forest in the middle of the city, with countless possibilities of walking, jogging cross-country (or rather cross-forest) skiing in the winter, and bike riding (the exciting Enduro Trails). You may also want to go for a walk around the neighbourhood – following the tips provided by Olszówka Association – to discover the relics of impressive summer residences that once belonged to wealthy factory owners. In the summer try ice-cream from a small ice-cream kiosk next to the bus stop, or drop by to Peron café for a sweet snack – the establishment is situated in an old carban, so yes, there were once trams in Bielsko-Biala.

MOUNTAIN TRIPS

Bielsko-Biala is a city where only a dozen minutes of a car or bus ride separate you from entering a mountain trail. In the summer you'll be rewarded with a refreshing coolness of forests, and in the winter you'll experience a fairy-tale world accessible e.g. on cross-country skis. And if you always need a reason for hiking, free you inner Indiana Jones and try geocaching – the mountains are rich in treasures.

DĘBOWIEC

The best spot to admire the panorama of Bielsko-Biala. You can get there on foot or by an all-year chair lift. Dębowiec offers climbing experience in a nature park, too, and for the youngest generation – a playground on the top! The ski slope on Dębowiec is just perfect to start your skiing adventure (in a city!), and the toboggan run is great fun for both children and adults. You may also treat Dębowiec as a mountain restaurant and try the famous vegan stew or dumplings with blueberries. And after that, burn the calories by hitting the road – up the hill or to Luise Valley.

SZYNDZIELNIA

The fastest route to the oldest mountain lodge (made of stone!) in the Beskid Mountains goes via cable car. We promise that a ride in a yellow gondola will cause an adrenaline influx. Next to the top terminal station there's an 18-meter observation tower, from which you can see the city, almost the whole Beskids range, and, in good weather, even the Tatras Mountains. We recommend Jaskinia Żółtodzioba (the Greenhorn's Cave) nestled on the north-east slope of Szyndzielnia (enter only with a certified guide!). Furthermore, once a year, during Lotos Jazz Festival – Bielska Zadymka Jazz-owa, exquisite music is performed on Szyndzielnia.

BLATNIA

You may either get a little tired, or relax while climbing the mountain, depending on your choice of trail. In the summer you'll meet a lot of blueberry gatherers, harvesting the bushes on the trails.

KOZIA GÓRA

Very popular among mountain bikers. However, if you aren't into enduro biking, you may still go there to see the remains of a luge track that was once the longest one in Europe.

KLIMCZOK

Close to the top look for a rock garden made of stones that were brought here from all over the world.

MAGURKA WILKOWICKA

The trail from Przeglębek seems to be the best spot to start your experience with mountains, because you can meet even 3-year-old tourists there. After the first uphill climb, you'll be quickly rewarded with a beautiful view on the city.
